



Levels of CRHESI Involvement in Projects 2022

This document will assist CHRESI members, leads and the Executive Committee in deciding how involved CRHESI is in specific projects, including gaining and providing specific resources (funds, staff and member time, networking, knowledge mobilization platforms, etc.).

A fundamental assumption is that the topic of the project is aligned in terms of CRHESI [content](#) areas and [principles](#).

CRHESI Role	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ CRHESI member is a primary or co-primary applicant / investigator and identifies CRHESI as a lead organization in the project. ✓ CRHESI, via the member lead, will ensure capacity development (e.g., involving trainees and cross-learning to-from community/academia) and is responsible for progress, reporting, KMb, etc. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ CRHESI, as an organization and/or via a member lead, is a collaborator providing resources but does not bear responsibility for the project. ✓ Collaboration may be as a researcher, with a specific required skill set (e.g., methods, access to students) or as a community leader, with involvement with an affected community, and who can facilitate involvement of the community. ✓ CRHESI works to facilitate inclusion of trainees and KMb activities. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ CRHESI, as an organization and/or via a member lead, is a contributor to the project, supporting specific needs that benefit the community and/or Western’s academic mission, including capacity development. ✓ CRHESI’s involvement must be authentic and supportive of community needs, not tokenistic or facilitating simple data collection that does not lead to community benefit.
Funding & Resources	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Funding can be through academic research grants, and/or community grants, depending on the lead(s) and type of project. ✓ Contributions are substantive and CRHESI receives direct funding for staff time and other activities with a direct cost (web development, events, etc.). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ No direct funding received but in-kind contributions are significantly less than Level 1 but more than Level 3 (e.g., networking support, staff or other member time, etc.) and are calculated as a specific contribution to the project. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ No funding received by CRHESI. ✓ Supports from CRHESI are in-kind and focused on the activities outlined in the letter of support or other agreement They are generally minor in scope/cost (e.g., advertising events, posting materials to our Radar, website, etc.).
