705 contacts made

56 people reached through drop in program

### PARTICIPANTS

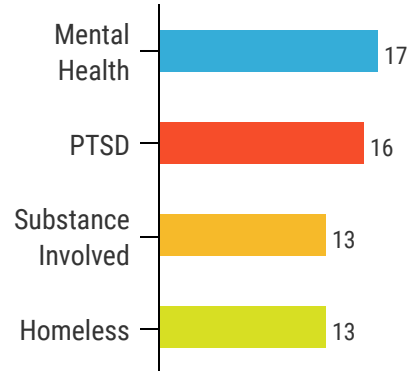
31 individually supported

## How the Program Helped

"There is no other program like this in London" (Partner)

"I am finding how urgent the need is for housing support... the more pressing issue is or becomes housing" (Case Manager)

## Impact - What's Changing

"Got me to believe in myself"

"I wouldn't have gotten the medical attention I needed"

"I would not have gotten housing...I would have returned to an abusive ex...This program has been life changing for me"

"Before I felt so in the dark and so lonely ...but with this program it completely changed that"
